Board of Trustees Nomination Form

Only members of the Chapel are eligible to serve as trustees. (Art V – Constitution)

Board members should be active participants faithful in attending worship and committed to attend scheduled Board meeting the Board of Trustees consists of seven members. Each member serves a term of two years with option to extend. After serving, they shall not be eligible for re-election until one full year has elapsed. In the case of a vacancy, the Board shall appoint a Chapel member to serve out the term.

The Board of Trustees is the legal body for holding property, caring for the buildings and grounds, and providing for public worship.

The Board of Trustees meets one Wednesday of each month in the Roy M. Terry Center at 6:30 PM. Summer meetings are scheduled as needed.

The new members of the Board are inducted at the annual business meeting in the fall. The annual meeting this year is Oct. 21.
